

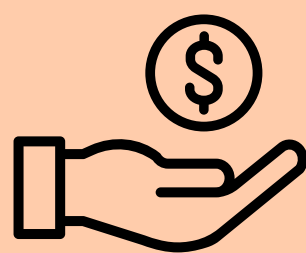
CONTRACT CHEATERS

SEVEN TIPS TO DETECT CONTRACT CHEATERS

DON'T BE FOOLED! CONTRACT CHEATERS (LIKE CHEGG) EXPLOIT STUDENTS AND MAKE \$\$\$ DOING IT

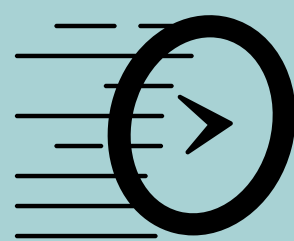
1: THEY CHARGE A FEE

- They charge a fee or a "free" service.
- Sometimes, that "fee" is uploading your essay or a class syllabus in exchange for access to other "free" resources.
- After using them, they can leverage you for more money.



2: HOMEWORK SOLUTIONS THE SAME DAY

- Completing a cited essay with resources in one day is impossible.
- They mass produce essays in an "essay mill."
- They reuse essays about your topic and share them.



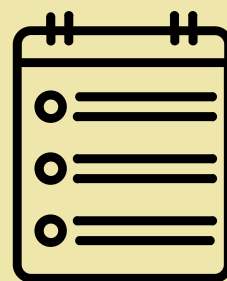
3: 24-HOUR ASSISTANCE

- A "pop-up" window appears asking if you need help.
- It is an Artificial Intelligence programmed to trick you.
- A legitimate tutor does not work 24 hours a day.



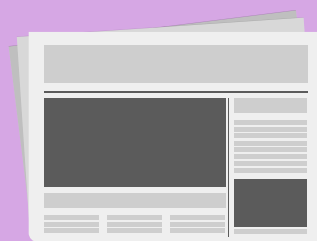
4: TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- When you agree to their terms and conditions, you give them ownership of whatever you upload.
- If you ask a contract cheater to take down what you uploaded - they will. BUT, they keep the documents and can share them with other contract cheaters.



5: NEWS LOGOS ON THEIR WEBSITE

- News channels do not endorse private ventures.
- This is another method to trick you.



6: GRADUATION PHOTOS ON THEIR WEBSITE

- These photos can be found anywhere on the Internet.
- They have not helped students graduate. It's a lie!



7: EDUCATIONAL EXPERTS WITH THEIR "ACCREDITATION"

- These individuals are likely the owners of the business.
- There is no evidence their credentials are legitimate.
