We all have a role to play in preventing and responding to sexualized violence.

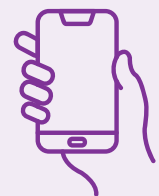

Support

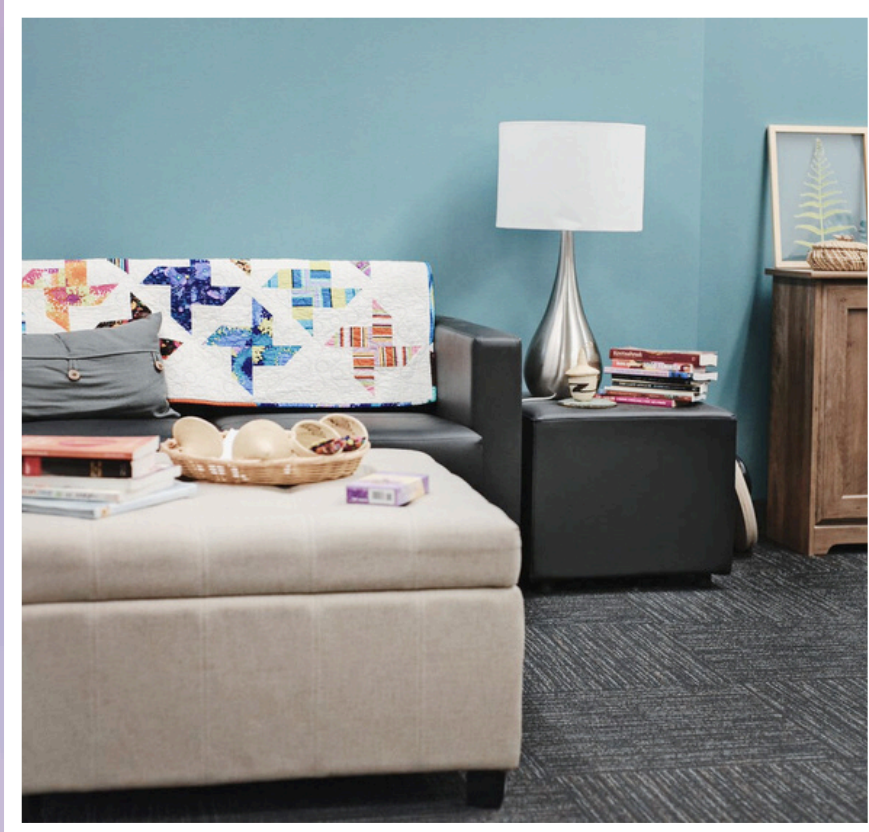
- Emotional support and safety planning for survivors of violence (recent or historic)

Implementation, education and revision of TRU's Sexualized Violence Policy



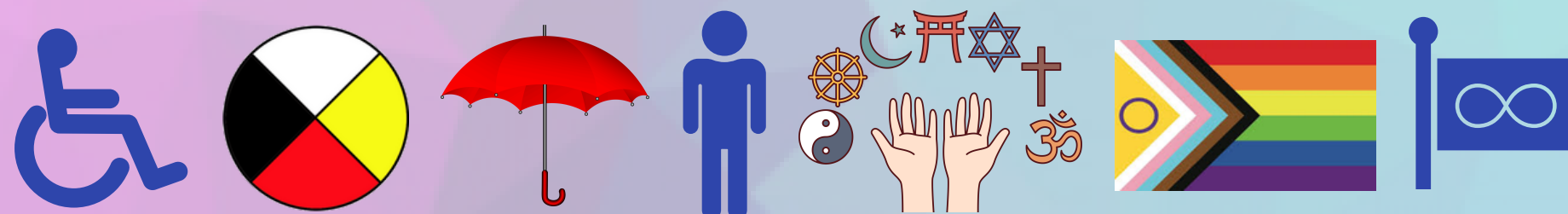
